His wife established a scholarship in her husband's name after he died in a plane crash.

Dear Dr. Philpott :

It is my desire to establish a Scholarship Fund in memory of my husband, Captain Wade Franklin Botts, who died in the crash of his RF 84 Alabama Air National Guard jet plane near Prattville, Alabama on 8 August 1970.

Wade Botts was born and reared on a farm near Banks Alabama, in Pike County, Alabama. He attended Banks Elementary and Junior High School, and graduated from Pike County High School in Brundidge, Alabama May 1960.

He was active in sports and made several all—state selections as an offensive and defensive football halfback. He attended Florida State University on a Football Scholarship for one year and transferred to Auburn University.

Wade loved Auburn University, and studied in the School of Engineering for two years until selected by the United States Air Force to attend the undergraduate pilot training program, and graduated 4 August 1966.

He then rejoined the Alabama Air National Guard and continued his studies at Auburn University, until accepting a job with Eastern AirLines where he served as Flight Engineer and First Officer until his death on 8 August 1970.

This Scholarship Fund shall be administered by Auburn University for deserving students (\*paraphrasing the remainder of her letter here) enrolled in the Auburn Air Force ROTC program.

Bruce graduated in 1966 from Auburn University with a Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering. After graduation he worked for the Alabama Highway Department for 3 years, before joining Gilbane Building Company (headquartered in Providence, RI) in 1969.

Some of the projects he was involved in during his career with Gilbane were the Social Security complex in Baltimore, MD., several projects in Washington, D.C., the airport expansion in Orlando, FL., as well as several pharmaceutical building projects.

In 1993, Bruce and his wife Robin moved to Providence, RI, where Bruce did many projects in the area before becoming the first Quality Manager for Gilbane and writing the company's Quality Control manuals and procedures. He retired from Gilbane in 2005.

In 2011 Bruce and Robin moved to Tallahassee, Florida to be closer to their children and to other family members.

Bruce enjoyed slap-stick comedy, collecting clocks, going to flea markets and yard/garage sales, reading, gardening and collecting Scrimshaw items.

He died from end stage Alzheimer's dementia.

Bruce is survived by Robin, his wife of 50 years, and by his daughter Amber Bradbury Poore (husband Tom), his son Dirk Bradbury (wife Julia), his Grandson Hayden Bradbury, his sister Gail Bradbury Johnson (husband Dave) and by many nieces and nephews.

Bruce was cremated and his ashes will be scattered in a nearby lake.

Bruce Bradbury started his career at Gilbane in the summer of 1969 and retired in the summer of 2005. During his tenure here he made a large and lasting impact on the company. Early in his career he worked on landmark projects in Rhode Island, North Carolina, Pennsylvania and Florida. Later he became Gilbane's first quality manager and helped create the operations manuals and procedures that still guide the company.

Vice Chairman Paul Choquette says, "Bruce brought quality assurance to a new level at Gilbane and mentored many others who built the tradition of doing it right the first time. He wrote many of the manuals that helped drive our consistency of performance and would have been enthusiastic about what the use of modern technology is doing for us today."
